Training Programs

I have developed several training programs with funding from the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), the World Health Organization and the Pan American Health Organization. NIDA and NIAAA have supported the development of an online tutorial based on the second edition of the book, <u>Publishing Addiction Science</u> (Babor et al., 2008). I led the development of training programs in publication ethics and research integrity, much of the work summarized in the third edition of <u>Publishing Addiction Science</u> (Babor et al., 2017, Ubiquity Press). The tutorial deals with research integrity and publication ethics, and is available without cost at http://www.parint.org/tutorial.cfm. WHO has supported the development of tutorials for the AUDIT and ASSIST screening tests, which are available on the PAHO website

(http://www.paho.org/hq/index.php?option=com_content&view=article&id=8826&Itemid=2&lang=en) I also developed a course for the same virtual campus in alcohol and drug policy.

Recently, I developed the Certificate in Addiction Science (CAS), an online graduate certificate within the Graduate Program in Public Health at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. The four courses were developed under a R25 grant funded by the US National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (TF Babor, PI/PD, 2016-2018). The courses are designed to promote clinical, epidemiological and policy research on alcohol. The courses are: 1) Research Careers and the Responsible Conduct of Research in Alcohol and Addiction Science; 2) Epidemiology of Substance Use Disorders and Psychiatric Comorbidities; 3) Clinical and Social Service Systems Research in Alcohol and Addiction Science; 4) Alcohol and Drug Policy.
